Letter from the PMIA President

Happy New Year, Neighbors!

So happy you have joined us in Philipse Manor for this new year and beginning of a new decade. I invite you to renew your membership in the Philipse Manor Improvement Association (PMIA) in 2020.

PMIA made numerous improvements in our Manor in 2019. We repaired both signs at our north and south entrances, fixed potholes in the parking area, completed restoration of our Grand Central Eagle, and welcomed a 50/50 cost-sharing sidewalk program from the Sleepy Hollow Village. PMIA promoted a composting program, helped solicit grant money for Fremont Pond clean up, and initiated pollinator pathway gardens in Philipse Manor common spaces with Sleepy Hollow Village government support. PMIA works to maintain and improve our surroundings and environment.

In 2019 we hosted wonderful events. The PMIA July Fourth Parade and Picnic was a huge success, the Headless Horseman made his first appearance at our Halloween Ragamuffin Parade, and we received a record number of submissions for our Halloween Home Decorating Contest. New neighbors keep pouring in and we welcomed them at our New Neighbors Spring Social, hosted in partnership with Philipse Manor Beach Club. Members have many fond memories from PMIA sponsored activities.

Gratefully, PMIA membership numbers continue rising in support of our efforts. We now count as active members the largest percentage of Philipse Manor households in decades. In 2020, we will continue monitoring Village Trustee meetings for topics that relate to our Manor. We will continue pushing for improvements in our streets, sidewalks, curbs and other infrastructure. We will work diligently to improve our parking area at the station. We plan to open sightlines behind the Eagle (revealing more of the Hudson and the new bridge). We are planning more events for our members. And we continue our commitment to communication as we focus on quality and quantity of newsletters, social media, and email blasts.

Our annual members' meeting took place at the Hudson Valley Writers Center in December. We said goodbye to four retiring board members, while giving others an opportunity to join our board of directors. Thanks go out to Marjorie Hsu Buckler, Dawn Kriss, Jenny Heater McMahon, and Alex Mulvey for their generous efforts in helping to make Philipse Manor the greatest place to live. We welcome aboard fresh energy and new skills in Mackenzie Dawson, Darren Mitchell, Lynn Moffat and Jaap Ritzen. I am excited for the year ahead. At our annual meeting our members unanimously approved our 2020 budget and a new dues rate. Dues are only \$100 per household, per year (\$75 for seniors). Author, statesman and traveler: Washington Irving profoundly impacted American culture. He is known today primarily for the American folktales found in The Sketchbook of Geoffrey Crayon, Gent., which celebrates its 200th anniversary in 2019-2020. This collection famously contains "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" and "Rip Van Winkle," two stories that romanticize colonial life on the Hudson River.

The Villages of Sleepy Hollow and Tarrytown, together with a number of partner organizations, are exploring Irving's cultural and artistic legacy in celebrations that will

engage the local community and our many visitors throughout 2020.

For example, in April 2020, they will host a three-day literary conference that brings together Irving scholars, experts in 19th century literature and history, with the public.

In addition, the Sleepy Hollow Lit Fest will return on June 13th, 2020 with a celebration of the villages of Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow, with events, readings, and panels along the route of Ichabod Crane's literary journey down Broadway to the Old Dutch Church and beyond.
